	2.6 Student Performance and Learning	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> College Result for the current academic year is satisfactory as per the goals set by IQAC.

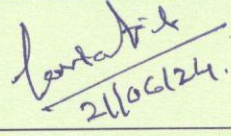
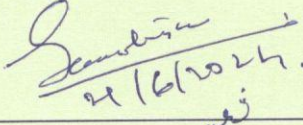
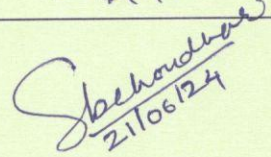
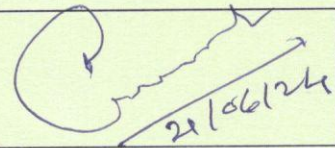
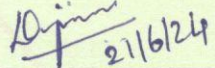
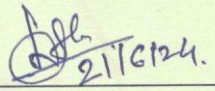
